

CENTRE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH PRIVACY NOTICE

Queen's University Belfast ("we", "us" and "our") is committed to protecting your personal data. The notice is addressed to rare disease support groups who are part of this research study which focuses on the impact of COVID-19 ("you" and "your"). This Privacy Notice tells you why we need to collect personal information about you, what we will do with it, and how we will look after it. It also tells you about your legal rights in relation to your Personal Data. If you have any questions about this privacy notice, please contact us. Contact details are provided below.

WHO WE ARE

1. We are Queen's University Belfast, a university with a reputation for excellence in education and research and a member of the Russell Group. Founded in 1845 as Queen's College Belfast, we became an independent university in 1908. This research is being conducted as part of the School of Medicine, Dentistry and Biomedical Sciences, within the Centre for Public Health.

HOW YOUR PERSONAL DATA IS COLLECTED

2. **Information you provide:** When conducting this research project you will be invited to take part in a survey. We will ask for information about you, such as your gender and age. This is known as your "Personal Data".

HOW WE USE YOUR PERSONAL DATA

- 3. We use your Personal Data and Sensitive Personal Data in the following ways:
 - This information will be used as background information to provide an overview of how the sample is composed. The main purpose of the project is to evaluate the impact COVID-19 has had on rare disease support groups. Results from this project will be collated anonymously and used to help improve the accessibility of resources and addressing the needs of individuals affected by rare disease(s) in Northern Ireland. We appreciate and welcome your input to this project.

LEGAL BASIS FOR COLLECTING AND USING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

- 4. We will only use your Personal Data if we have valid reasons for doing so. These reasons are known as our "legal basis for processing". In certain circumstances we may ask for your consent to process your information. At other times we may be required to process your information to enable us to fulfil our part of the contract we have with you. There are circumstances where we have a legitimate interest to process your personal data, for example to provide you with a service which you have requested. The legal basis for processing your Personal Data is,
 - 'Consent', you the participant, have given consent to the processing of your personal data for the specific purposes outlined in section (3), 'How we use your personal data'.

WHO WE SHARE YOUR DATA WITH

- 5. In line with our Data Protection Policy and Procedures we can share your information, including Personal Data and Sensitive Personal Data, with the following parties for the purposes set out above:
 - The software used to complete this survey will be from the QUB standard supplier list (<u>https://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/</u>). The email addresses of respondents will be stored on encrypted software. The researchers named in this project will not copy or share this private data.

DATA PROCESSING OUTSIDE EUROPE

6. We will not transfer your Personal Data and Sensitive Personal Data outside of the European Economic Area.

HOW LONG YOUR INFORMATION WILL BE KEPT

7. We will keep your Personal Data and Sensitive Personal Data for up to 5 years from date of collection. We will only keep your information if we need it for one of the reasons described above. We place great importance on the security of the Personal Data that we hold, including the use of physical, technological and organisational measures to ensure your information is protected from unauthorised access and against unlawful processing, accidental loss, alteration, disclosure, destruction and damage.

YOUR RIGHTS

- 8. The Data Protection Act 2018 provides you with a number of legal rights in relation to your Personal Data, including the right:
 - to request access to your Personal Data;
 - to request correction of your Personal Data that is wrong or incomplete;
 - to request erasure or the restriction of processing of your Personal Data;
 - to request the transfer of your Personal Data in a structured; commonly used machine-readable format;
 - not to be subject to automated decision making; and
 - to withdraw your consent.
- 9. If you wish to exercise any of the rights set out above, or require further information about any of the rights, please contact us.
- 10. Where we need to collect your Personal Data, whether for the purposes of providing a service you have requested or under the terms of a contract we have with you, and you fail to provide that information when requested, we may not be able to provide the service or perform the contract. We may, therefore, have to cancel the contract or the service we provide to you but we will notify you if this is the case at the time.
- 11. There may also be times where we cannot stop using your Personal Data when you ask us to, but we will tell you about this if you make a request.
